Raven's Roost – 9085 Nuthatch Place (see map for parking and garden locations.)

This garden is on the property of a co-housing community and is the work of the residents who live there. It could easily be described as a small farm because they have so many different features related to farming. They have hoop houses and vegetable gardens. They also have raised beds with a variety of different plantings. They have honey bees and a small orchard. I can't describe all there is to be seen on the lovely property but it is clearly the cooperative work of many.

Peggy Kelly – 9101 King David

This garden is at the residence of Peggy Kelly. She has been working on this landscape for many years and the garden has evolved over time to be a lovely collection of perennials and annuals for continuing color.

<u>Providence Hospital</u> (See map for parking and walking routes to gardens)

You will have three separate gardens to view on the property of Providence Hospital. The hospital has requested that:

- 1. We park in Northeastern parking lot (outlined in red);
- 2. not walk through the hospital to get to the gardens and
- 3. no photographs taken at these gardens out of respect for the privacy of patients.
- A. There is a <u>Healing Garden</u> filled with plants and trees. It has a peaceful vibe as you meander along the paths which are punctuated with poetry written by hospital employees. There are several different themes present in this beautiful garden.
- B. The next garden is a **Memorial Garden** dedicated to employees of Providence.
- C. And finally, the gardens at the <u>main entrance</u> to the hospital is glowing with an abundance of annuals and perennials. Many of the plantings are grown on site in their greenhouse. As you drive by on Providence Drive look up to see the tumble of nasturtiums basking in the sun.

Julie Zerkel - 5843 Cobbler Dr.

The final garden is what gardener Julie describes as a fusion of an English Garden and an Alaskan Garden. This is a great example of what can be done on a challenging slope. The terraced beds are filled with annuals and perennials to provide constant color and a water feature tumbles down the steep slope. Although this is not a large garden it is packed with color and several spaces for enjoying the outdoor space.
